
Netherland Dwarf Frosty



Note to Judges— Juniors may have a very light haze but should show some color development, especially on the ears.

The surface color will show a uniform distribution of ticked hairs over the entire animal with the exception of eye circles, underside of tail, belly, inside the legs, and nape of neck where white is expected. The ears and tail are frosted more heavily than the body. Ticking is acceptable in black, blue, chocolate, or lilac. Belly color and undercolor are to be light pearl to white. Nails – Light in color. Eyes – Brown or blue-gray.

Faults—Lack of uniformity in surface color. Excessively dark color showing saddle shading.

Disqualification from Competition— Absence of ticking. Slate undercolor.

Eligible to be entered in all ARBA sanctioned shows as **exhibition animals**.

May **NOT** compete for Best of Breed or BIS
