circles, underside of jowls, tail, and belly may be pale cream. Eyes- Brown in Black and Chocolate varieties; Blue-gray in Blue and Lilac varieties.

Faults—Poor intermixing of colors, faded or weak base color, spots or stripes.

Disqualifications from Competition—Tortoise color or discernable shading. Definite white spots. White toenails. Any identifiable Harlequin marking on the ears, face, chest, forelegs, rear legs, and/or body. A Harlequin marking is defined as a large and distinctly solid colored bar or band across the body or a distinct and solid colored alternation across the ears, face, chest, or legs.

Brindle—Black/Orange, Blue/Fawn, Chocolate/Orange, and Lilac/Fawn compete together.

(Quality of Color: 5 points; Distribution of color: 10 points)

Brindle will consist of an even distribution of one of the following two-color combinations: Rich lustrous black and bright golden-orange, rich lustrous blue and bright golden-fawn, rich lustrous chocolate and bright golden-orange or rich lustrous lilac and bright golden-fawn. An even distribution of color is of most importance. Ideally, no one color will take precedence over another. Toenails may be light, dark, or mismatched. Note: Eye
